About us

Composition, Rhetoric, and Digital Media (CRDM) is a Master's program at the Nova Southeastern University School of Communication, Media, and the Arts. The goal of CRDM is to build long-term success with employability in mind. Graduates will prepare to pursue further studies as well as a variety of careers in publishing, editing, and more. Admissions

Admissions is on a rolling basis. After completing the online application and submitting the required documents, candidates are individually reviewed by a faculty committee, as NSU considers each applicant in terms of potential for success in the program. An admissions decision is made within four weeks of applying.

Curriculum

CRDM provides students with a foundation for conducting and presenting research, applying rhetorical theories, teaching writing, and producing digital media.

Assistantships

Prospective and current CRDM students are welcome to apply to become a graduate assistant. A variety of positions are available.
